Within this project, students will research artists to help them develop their own ideas and be expected to show their development in sketchbooks and annotate any sketches and examples. Students will develop ideas by experimenting with a range of media, materials and processes. | Students are given a choice of themes to choose for their third project. Themes could include: Nature into art and Concealment They will be given guidance and support to develop this theme based on the four assessment objectives and expected to work within a time frame. Within this project, students will research artists to help them develop their own ideas and be expected to show their development in sketchbooks and annotate any sketches and examples. Students will develop ideas by experimenting with a range of media, materials and processes. | Developed an awareness of colour theory, mark making and the main elements of art. Developed observational drawing skills using a range of media. Researched artists to help develop own ideas. Students will have individually developed themes and ideas, showing their development in their sketchbooks and annotating any sketches and examples.
