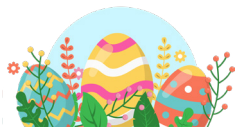

MESSAGE FROM THE HEADTEACHER

In typical fashion we go into our last week of term with a multitude of cross-curricular activities. This term, our focus is on Careers, where pupils will explore the range of work available to them as well as having the chance to put their enterprising skills into practice.

Equipping our pupils with skills for the wider world is always an important part of what we do at Glebe, as is the focus on ensuring all of them leave with a range of qualifications, especially in English and Maths. This term we have reinforced the importance of this through numeracy activities in tutor time, daily reading and a celebration of World Book Day.

Other success to celebrate has also come by way of Glebe being awarded the Arts Mark Silver award. This is in recognition of all the work that we do to encourage participation and involvement in the Arts and I must thank Mrs Moore and Miss Boulton for this achievement.

Through our wider curriculum this term we have seen pupils go on visits to the National Portrait Gallery and Greenwich fire station, as well as competing in football tournaments over at Long Lane. Additionally, there is a revamped lunch club schedule now up and running that includes Martial Arts, Fencing and Dance. As always, it is wonderful to see so many of our pupils taking part in these clubs.

After the Easter break we enter into a critical time for our year 11 pupils as they prepare to sit their exams. Understandably, this is a difficult time for many young people as nerves start to creep in, so constant reassurance and support is needed to help them prepare and to succeed in these exams. Here, pupils will find a range of revision tips and resources to help them.

Finally, from me, thank you to all of you that attended the Parents' Evenings this term. Since moving to a virtual Parents' Evening platform, we have seen an overall increase in attendance, with over 90% of year 7 and 11 families attending this term. For being a mentor to his classmates as a PE leader. He is extremely supportive and hard working.

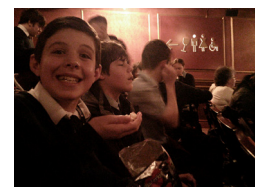
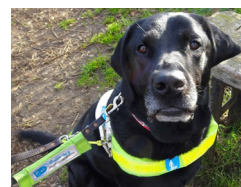

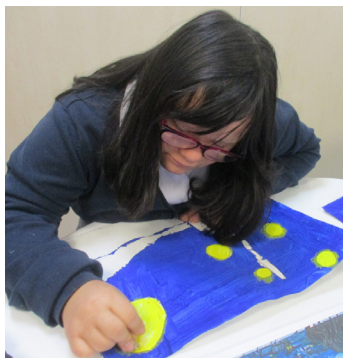
Cross curricular day provided some fantastic workshops, looking at people who help us - there were workshops with First Aiders and Guide Dogs for the blind.
