Please encourage your child to take a more active part in everyday activities at home, such as shopping and paying for items, as well as encourage discussions about budgeting in the context of everyday life.

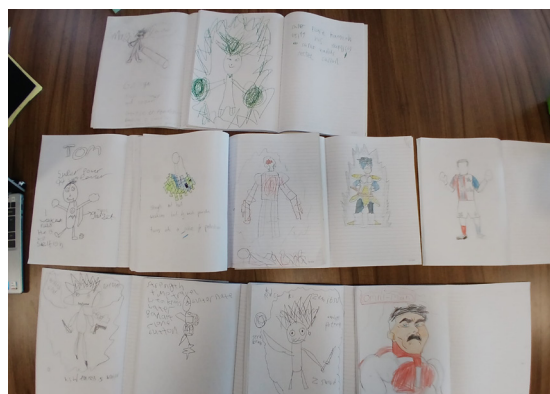
