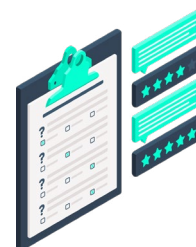

## PROVISION

In technology, KS3 have finished their Konibori fish kites and are very proud of their final pieces. They took them for their first flights this week and are looking forward to flying them with their families.

KS4 Oak Class rounded off their Art Award qualification with a visit to Bethlem Gallery to see Daniel Regan's exhibition, '(\*be)longing'. Students were fascinated by Daniel's exploration of his neurodivergence through photographs developed in solutions mixed with his medication. They also viewed micro-commissions by Michael Mendones and Nina Gross. Michael's work combined a film of professionals dancing to his music with reflections on his late autism diagnosis, while Nina recreated her home from memory through delicate paper sculptures.

Inspired by the exhibition, students created their own artworks exploring themes of belonging before sharing what belonging means to them: 'love and joy', 'safety', 'friends', 'to be loved and cared for', and 'being happy'.

Ms Walker's KS5 Maths class continue exploring comparative language in maths, focussing on mass. Students explored the vocabulary through real objects, sorting and discussing them. Sixth Form are now looking towards spending some quality time with those students moving on from Glebe at the residential trip to Frylands Wood before the Leavers last day on July 3<sup>rd</sup>.
