Half Term One-Two: Arts Award: Hansel and Gretel cont.  Part A: Explore the arts as a participant- students will participate in a performance of Hansel and Gretel from start to finish. They will need to show progress made throughout rehearsal and feedback.  Part B: Explore the arts as an audience member-Students will watch a live/recorded theatre performance and be able to review and discuss it.  Part C: Arts inspiration- Students will research the Kneehigh Theatre Company and be able to share their findings with their group either practically or through a poster.  Part D: Arts skills share- Students will be able to help create their performance piece. This can be through the leading of a Drama game or directing a part of their scene.  Students will also take part in a theatre trip to London to complete Part B of the qualification.  *Level 1 is equivalent to GCSE grades 1-3. Arts Award Explore is available to lower ability learners and is equivalent to an Entry Level qualification.	By the end of year 9 students will have completed three years of Drama study and have learnt a variety of skills through different genres and practitioners.  Students will be able to work in a group and as an individual to complete pieces of theatre for performance.  They will be able to take on and progress their performance skills using peer and teacher feedback.
