Year 9 Textiles (10 weeks)	<p><u>Health and Safety Mini Project</u> Students are introduced to Health and Safety in the classroom and the importance of following rules, to keep themselves and each other safe.</p> <p><u>Introduction to Fabrics and Fibres – Mini Project</u> Students are introduced to a variety of fabrics and sort them into manmade and natural fibres. They will learn about the basic process by which fibres are made into fabric.</p> <p><u>Hand Puppet Project, Students should:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Produce a hand puppet mood board/mind map of ideas. • Design four different hand puppets on a chosen theme. • Select their best design and draw a final design for their puppet. • Cut out a paper pattern for their hand puppet and pin it to felt fabric. • Accurately cut a front and a back for their puppet out of felt using the paper pattern. • Thread a needle and tie a knot independently. • Hand stitch the front and the back of their hand puppet together using a running stitch or overcast stitch. • Decorate their puppet using sequins, buttons, and felt. • Evaluate their finished puppet. 	<p>Students will learn the basics of staying safe in the classroom.</p> <p>Students will use equipment independently.</p> <p>Students will learn basic stitching techniques.</p> <p>Students will develop design skills and make design decisions independently.</p> <p>Students will make choices based on their interests and tastes.</p> <p>Students will have a basic understanding of manmade and natural fibres and how they are made into fabric.</p>
