Sheep

Sheep are shy animals. They all eat together and rest together. A group of sheep is called a flock.

Some sheep live on hill farms. The farmer on a hill farm uses a sheepdog to collect the flock of sheep. The flock is moved from place to place.

The mother sheep is called an ewe. The father sheep is called a ram. Baby sheep are called lambs. They are born in the spring. When lambs are about three weeks old they start to play together.

As the weather gets warmer, the farmer shears the sheep's wool. Coats, scarves and gloves are made from wool. Wool keeps up warm.

A sheep's skin is used to make rugs and slippers.
