4a. Choose a digit card to complete the number sentences below.

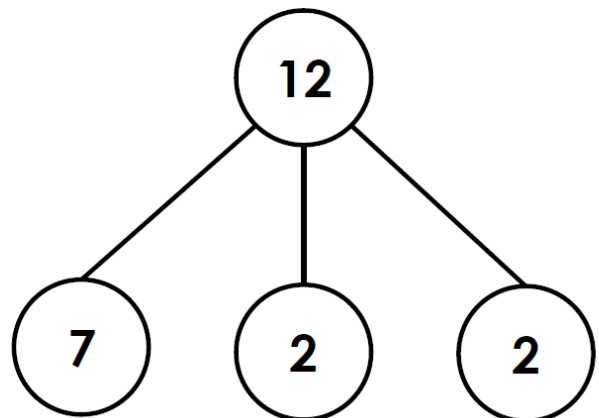


$$6 + \square + 8 = 18$$

5b. Macy is using the part-whole model to calculate  $7 + 4$  by making 10.

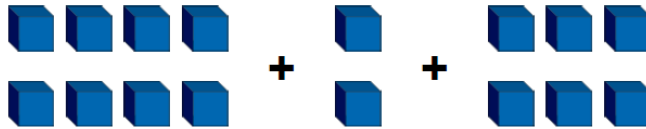


Is she correct? Explain why.

6a. Eric is solving  $8 + 6$ .
