



Task 3- Read the information below about Roman and Celtic women.

ROMAN AND CELT WOMEN

Throughout History life for women has been pretty tough. They usually had very little freedom and were not allowed to do most of the things that men did. Although this was true in most cultures across the world it was not always the case. Roman and Celtic women had very, very different types of lives. Roman women had almost no freedom. They had to do what their fathers and then their husbands told them to do and couldn't argue back. Husbands could even kill their wives for drinking wine. Celtic women led very different lives. They had a lot of freedom and sometimes a lot of power. In the Celtic culture they were very well respected (think of Boudicca).
