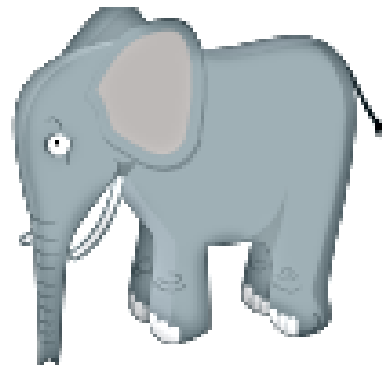

**Challenge:**

There are many different teeth for doing different jobs. The sharp incisors, bite and cut up food. The flat back teeth, grind food before it is swallowed. There are also pointed teeth near the front of your mouth that grip and pierce food. These are called canines. Animals such as lions have large canines to catch and kill prey.

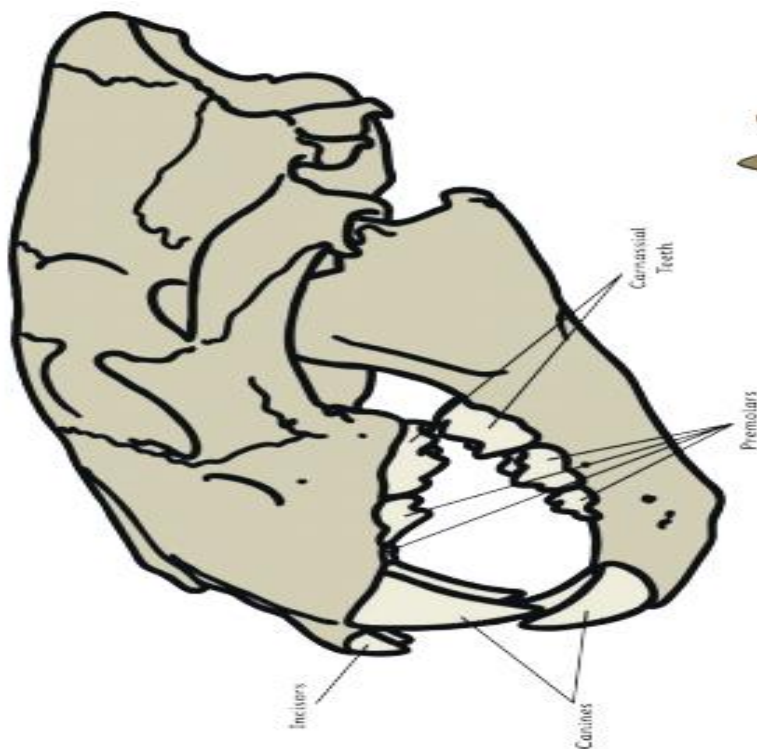
