
**TASK 2- Read the following information and label the Celt and Roman houses.**

All Homes need to provide people with the things they need to survive. Below is a list of things that all homes need to give people.

- \*Protection from the weather
- \*A place to sleep
- \*A place to wash
- \*A place to go to the toilet
- \*A place to cook and eat
- \*Heating


Roman and Celt homes also had to provide these things too. Look at the Roman and Celt homes below and label each of the arrows (you can just write the number next to the letter)

**Celtic Roundhouse**



- A. A dirt floor- Celt floors were made of hard packed dirt.
- B. A fire – A fire was in the middle of the room to give warmth.
- C. A pot – The Celts did not have plumbing everyone in the family would go to the toilet in a pot that was emptied.
- D. A roof hole- There was a hole in the roof so the smoke from the fire could escape. The room would be very smoky.
- E. Animal skins- the family slept on a straw bed with animal skins at night.
- F. Furniture – A few stools and benches were the only furniture in a Celtic Round house

## Roman Villa



- A. Mosaic floor – Floors in Roman houses were decorated with tiny coloured tiles and they had under floor heating!!
- B. Beds – The Romans slept in proper beds.
- C. Toilets – The Romans often had 2 toilets side by side. So people could talk to each other when they went to the toilet.
- D. Fountain – The Romans often had a fountain in their courtyard.
- E. Separate Kitchen – The Romans did their cooking in kitchens which were in a separate room.
- F. Bathtub – The Romans often had a bathtub in the house to bathe in.
- G. Hypocaust- This is the arched tunnel at the side of the house which provides the heat for the underfloor heating.
