Question	Answer
1	3 apples circled and 4 pears circled.
2	These objects could be sorted into two or three groups. Two groups: green fruit and red fruit. Three groups: pears, apples and strawberries.
3	Either circles and triangles, or blue shapes and red shapes.
4	Blue triangles, red circles and blue circles.
5	Open ended task. Children could sort pencils, cubes, toys etc.
